



Junior Ranger Art Bench Trail Activity

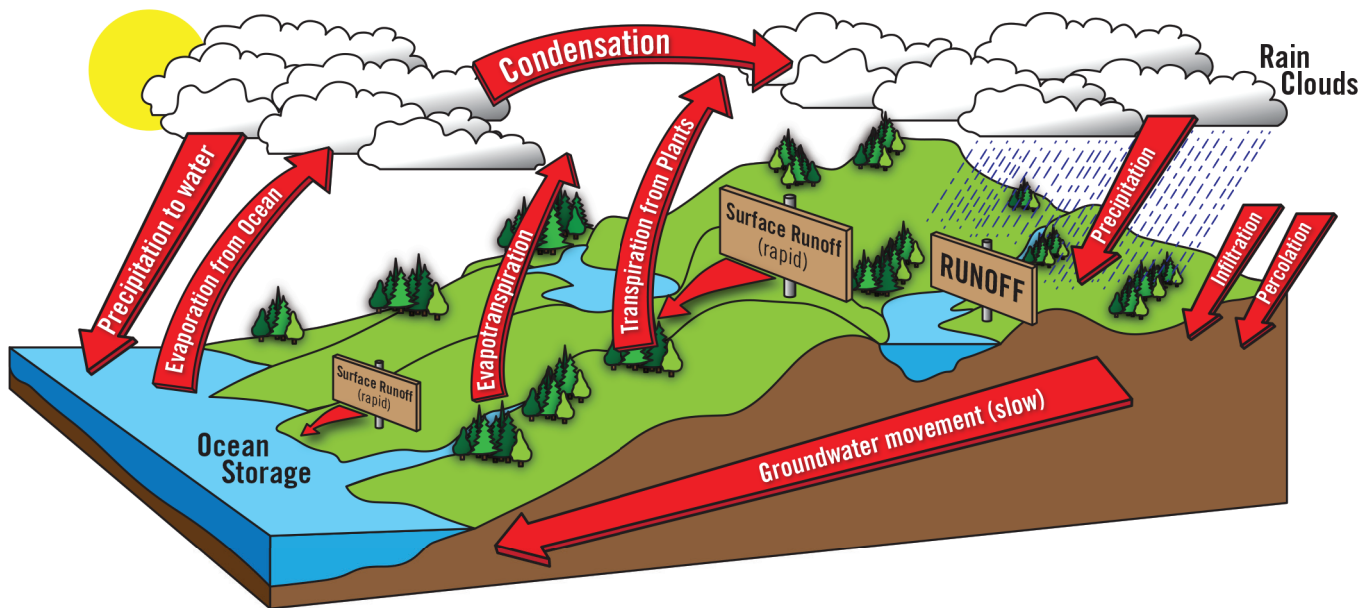


Discover Water Cycles

This activity can be done at any of the art benches.

Water travels constantly in the water cycle – in lakes, rivers, oceans, glaciers, animals, plants, soil, clouds, under the ground, and even inside of you!

Imagine you are a water molecule. Choose a stage in the water cycle to begin. Where do you go next? How did you get there? Now, where do you go from there, and how? Ask yourself those questions again, and again...



Look at the art bench. Do you see any images of water? Can you find anything else on the bench that relates to the water cycle or why having clean water is important? List three:

About 70% of the earth's surface is covered by water, but there is actually a very limited amount of fresh water available to humans, plants, and animals. Name three ways you can conserve water:



All of the water on earth has always been here, and it is the only water there ever will be. Our bodies are about 70% water, the same percentage as the amount of water covering the earth.
